That may exacerbate investors' recent dissatisfaction with Amazon — they have pushed down the company's shares 25 percent so far this year, as Bezos ramps up spending on fulfillment centers and delivery operations. Having Alibaba's shares trading on

# Dow, S&P gain on Yellen; Nasdaq down

 ${\color{red} \textbf{NEW YORK} - Stocks mostly}$ rose on Wednesday after comments from Federal Reserve Chair Janet Yellen signaled continued support for the economy, but the Nasdaq fell for a second session as momentum names sold off.

Financials and utilities were the day's biggest gainers, with the S&P financial sector index up 1.3 percent and the utilities sector index up 1.6

On the Nasdaq, Yahoo! Inc fell 6.6 percent to \$34.07 after Alibaba Group filed for an initial public offering that valued the Chinese e-commerce company well below analysts' consensus estimate.

uters that Alibaba's valuation estimates. disappointed some Yahoo investors. Yahoo holds a 22.6 percent stake in Alibaba, of which it must sell more than a third through the IPO.

"The Alibaba IPO is drawing money out of Internet stocks because investors have to raise capital for the Alibaba IPO. That's why we see pressure on names like Google, Facebook and Amazon today," said Tim Ghriskey, chief investment officer of Solaris Group in Bedford Hills, New York.

Google shares fell 1 percent to \$509.96 while Facebook shares slid 2 percent at \$57.39. Amazon.com Inc declined 1.6 percent to \$292.71.

Groupon Inc sank 20.7 percent to end at \$5.33 as its sales Analysts at BGC Partners and profit projections for the

Twitter Inc lost 3.7 percent to close at \$30.66 after leading a selloff in Internet shares on Tuesday with an 18 percent tumble.

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 117.52 points or 0.72 percent, to close at 16,518.54. The S&P 500 gained 10.49 points or 0.56 percent, to end at 1,878.21.

The Nasdaq Composite dropped 13.085 points or 0.32 percent, to finish at 4,067.673.



# IRS chief: U.S. could lose \$3b as budget forces fewer tax audits

**WASHINGTON** — The U.S. federal government could lose almost \$3 billion in revenue during the current fiscal year because budget cuts are forcing the Internal Revenue Service to audit fewer people, the agency's chief said Wednesday.

Testifying before a congressional panel, IRS Commissioner John Koskinen said the IRS will audit 100,000 fewer individuals this year as part of congressionally mandated cuts to the tax agency's budget. Audits of high-wealth individuals, businesses and partnerships will also decline, he said.

'This fiscal year, the IRS's key enforcement programs will operate well below
